

# What is being asked April 8...


Shall Stone County impose a tax on the charges for all sleeping rooms paid by the transient guests of hotels, motels, and short-term rentals situated in specific portions of Stone County at a rate of 3% for the sole purpose of tourism marketing?



# What the Lodging Tax Is & Who It Affects:

The 3% lodging tax applies to hotels, motels, bed & breakfasts, and short-term rentals (like AirBnB and VRBO). It does not impact apartments or long-term rentals.

The tax is paid primarily by visitors, not local residents, making it an equitable way to fund tourism promotion.



# Why Stone County Needs This Tax.



# High tide lifts all boats.

Our economy is tourism-driven; if tourism spending goes up, local revenues go up and local businesses prosper. Tourism marketing WORKS to drive visitation to a destination, and we know it works for Stone County.

Stone County must take control of its future by managing how our area is marketed, rather than relying on other communities.

# Every \$1 invested in local tourism marketing returns \$275 to the local economy.



Increased visitor spending supports community infrastructure, public services, and law enforcement benefiting both residents and businesses. The tax is estimated to generate between \$500,000-\$1 million per year initially.

By comparison, the City of Branson and TCED combine to spend approx. \$13 million annually, and have for over 20 years.


# Case Study: Perry County, Missouri

Population 18,250

Perry County votersapproved a 6% lodging tax in2019 for tourism promotion.

 Countywide revenue went from \$27 million in 2019 to \$38.5 million in 2024, a 43% increase!
